The <u>CA Latino Legislative Caucus Foundation's Scholarship Program</u>, now in its eighth year, is accepting online applications from eligible students. The program was established to assist deserving students by offering financial assistance to meet educational expenses. Fifty \$5,000 scholarships will be awarded this year.
