Opportunities through the Internship and Career Center (ICC)

Student registration for the first round of <u>Internship and Career Fairs</u> opened Monday, September 28. The Internship and Career Center is open virtually and is using a brand new platform on Handshake to host the fairs. There are several differences between this virtual fair experience and previous in-person fairs.

- Students/Alumni who wish to participate need to register for the fairs **and** sign up for the group and 1:1 employer sessions **in advance**. It is strongly recommended that students register early, and check back often for additional employer sessions.
- <u>Alum can request a Handshake account</u> if they don't already have one. **All new and** current students have a Handshake account.
- In Handshake, students:
 - are strongly encouraged to fill out and update their Handshake profiles, including year in school or alumni status, ASAP.
 - need to have their privacy level set to "Community" to sign up for group and 1:1 sessions or "Employer" for 1:1 sessions only. Students marked "Private" in Handshake are unable to sign up for employer sessions.
- The Internship and Career Center has several resources to support students preparing for the fair, and day of the fairs:
 - Document review
 - Virtual drop-in advising with peers and advising appointments with staff
 - Prepare for the Fair virtual workshops
 - Online resources, including the <u>Career Resource Manual</u> (includes sample resumes, cover letters, elevator pitches, and much more), updated <u>Prepare for</u> <u>the Fair web pages</u>, and <u>new career advising videos</u>.


