Spring 2020 Position

AAS 10 – African-American Culture & Society (50% Position, must attend lectures Tuesdays and Thursdays 1:40pm-3:00pm and lead two sections)

Critical examination of the historical, political, social, and economic factors that have affected the development and status of African-American people in contemporary society.

AAS 141 – Psychology of the African American Experience (50% position, must attend lectures Tuesdays and Thursdays 6:10pm-7:30pm and lead two sections)

Introduction to the psychological issues faced by African Americans. Description of any disparities in mental health care experienced by African American and Diaspora populations in the United States. Analysis of issues from European/Western and Afrocentric frame of reference. Emphasis on Optimal Theory, a psychological theory based on an Afrocentric world view.

AAS 165 – Afro-Christianity & the Black Church (50% position, must attend lectures Tuesdays and Thursdays 9:00am-10:20am and lead two sections)

Examination of the historical role of Christian belief and practice as well as the institution of the Black Church in the experience of African Americans, from slavery to the present.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Full-time registered graduate student
- 3.00 Minimum GPA or equivalent
- Must have attended, or will attend prior to beginning this position, the mandatory CEE TA orientation (offered every September).
- Must complete Sexual Harassment Prevention Training online prior to beginning position.
